This week your challenge is to take on a big build. Using only recyclable items such as cardboard or plastic. Can you build a tower taller than you? You will probably have to try this all sorts of different ways before you can get your tower solid and stable and tall too. Your tower must be able to stay standing for at least 5 seconds. If it stays up maybe you can ask someone to help you measure it. No cheating using tape, balance only! Good luck!



Mrs Mackenzie and Mrs Friel's challenge

Be a Natural Artist Explore our wonderful natural world.

Go on a nature walk (with an adult) or go into your garden. Collect a selection of natural materials (eg. leaves, twigs, stones, acorns, conkers, flowers, grass, soil, grass, etc.)

Big or small (on the ground, a tray, on paper) make a creation using the natural materials you collected. Have you created patterns? Is your creation symmetrical? Talk about the texture, size and length of the materials you used.



Miss Magee's challenge

Can you design and build a structure for a favourite toy (example-tower, bridge, shelter, castle, garage, cave or kennel)? What could you use (examplespegs, hankies, straws, things from recycle bin, twigs, cardboard or blocks/bricks)? How could you decorate it? Can you write a sign for it? What could you use to measure it? How will you take a picture of it? What else can you make? Be creative and have fun!



Mrs O'Hare's challenge

Can you make a puppet from your favourite story? You could use a wooden spoon, old sock or a stick. Then draw your character, cut it out and stick it on. Have a search and see what else you can find in your house to add on. Then you could use a cardboard box, or your toy box to make a stage. Decorate it with pens, stickers, wool, buttons, and then have your toys as the audience.
