School Communications



Many thanks to parents/carers for your co-operation in ensuring contact is made to the school via telephone call in the first instance. It is essential that the school conforms to Covid-19 risk mitigation guidelines by ensuring contact restrictions are strictly implemented. I strongly recommend regular view of the school website, Twitter and email for ongoing school communication. Support staff will not be available to collect children from classes for early dismissal during the period 2.30pm and 3pm.



School Uniform

Many thanks to parents/cares for assisting the children to present to school in full school uniform. I fully appreciate your support in dressing the children so well for school especially in the current circumstances. As reminder:

Pupils can wear shirt and tie.

Shoes should be black or navy.

Polo shirts to be worn on PE days.





Pupils can bring a school bag, water bottle and lunch box which will be stored under their desks.

There is no need for children to bring pencil cases – resources will be provided.

Pupils should not share resources or food stuffs.

Please ensure the children bring a **waterproof jacket** to school to enable them to participate in outdoor activities. If the children are wearing blazers, a light waterproof jacket can be stored in their school bag.

<u>PE</u>

PE will commence week beginning Monday 24th September. PE will currently be carried out outdoors. It is advised that children wear polo shirts on PE days to limit the need for changing. Gym shoes are predicted to be re-introduced on Tuesday 29th September 2020.

Snacks and Lunches

Intervals and lunches have been staggered to minimise contact between different class/stage groups.



Children sanitise their hands before and after eating and are seated in their play zones within the dining hall. Children should remember to bring water bottles, snacks and lunches with them in the morning as we will not be able to accept drop-offs through the school day. School lunches will be provided for children who forget their lunch and

information communicated to parent/carer. To take account of pupil allergies and Covid -19 safety measures, I ask that children do not share food or drink and that they do not bring fizzy drinks or any food containing nuts. It would be very helpful if parents/carers can ensure that the children's lunches or snacks are prepared in such a way that the children can access the food or drink independently e.g. snacks opened, drinks opened with lid secured or straw packaging opened etc. This measure is to avoid touch contact with food packaging for pupil and staff safety. Mobile Phones

Given that mobile phones cannot currently be stored at the school office, I ask that children do not bring mobile phones to school. Mobile phones must not be stored in children's jackets or bags.

Car Park/ School Environments

School parents should not park in the staff car park for pupil safety. Only 1 adult per child/family permitted to enter school grounds for collection, at a 2m distance from adults and children of other households. If social distancing is difficult, the wearing of a face covering is recommended. Dog's are not permitted in the school grounds. Please vacate the playground promptly.
